Dear Families

I'm excited to be given the opportunity to lead Shrewsbury Academy. It's a school I have had the pleasure of being part of since 2021, despite my brief departure to the Marches for the first part of this term. I have loved my time at the Marches and it was great to get a perspective of how things operate in other successful schools. My focus to begin with is to do everything I can to continue to build an inclusive culture within the school in which our students can thrive. Our focus is to improve the GCSE outcomes in Year 11, to ensure every student leaves with the maximum possible grades. All of our students are now on this journey from our youngest in year 7, through to our eldest in year 11, engaging with a curriculum designed to inspire and enrich their learning. Just this week some of our students visited Birmingham Hippodrome and at the end of next week some of our students fly to New York for 5 nights. We look forward to seeing the photographs from the Big Apple.

In the weeks ahead we will be changing our mobile phone policy in school. We are asking students to turn phones off and place them in their bags. It is important to understand why we are doing this. There is extensive research around the harmful effects of mobile phones on the teenage brain. The average screen time for teens is around 8 hours per day, a frightening statistic. Whilst they play an important part in many young people's lives, they can also expose our children to bullying, developing anxiety and can be detrimental to mental health. There is research that also shows they can actually reduce a child's ability to concentrate and effectively communicate with each other. We want our young people to talk to each other, learn social skills and be able to focus on their learning. Like many other schools we feel this step will support a positive learning culture and one I am sure you will support us with.

Free School Meal Vouchers over the October half-term holiday


