Free School Meals eligibility update

The free school meal (FSM) protections policy was introduced in 2018 to protect those eligible for benefits-related free school meals from becoming ineligible while Universal Credit (UC) is being rolled out. This was originally set to last until March 2022 and was subsequently extended to March 2023. The end date for protections has now been extended further until March 2025. This means that a pupil who was FSM eligible on 1 April 2018, or who has become eligible under the benefits/low-earnings criteria since then, will continue to receive free meals, even if their household income exceeds the eligibility threshold, up until March 2025 and then until the end of their phase of education (ie primary or secondary).

Mr Parkin is happy to answer any questions relating to this matter.

FSM vouchers at February Half term

To confirm, the local authority will be funding FSM vouchers again at the February half-term for benefits-related FSM pupils. These vouchers will be generated alongside two additional days, the strike date on the 1st February 2023 and the Trust collaboration day on the 17th February 2023. This makes a total of 7 days worth of funding.

These vouchers will be generated and forwarded to parents and carers on Friday 17th February 2023.
