
VE Day Celebrations.

On 8*th* May, year 11 commemorated Victory in Europe (VE) Day with a chemistry titration tea party, complete with scones and strawberries. The school also marked the occasion with a two-minute silence. Year 11 students are revising hard for their own forthcoming victory in GCSE examinations. Students and staff noted that WWII spurred numerous technological and scientific advancements. These innovations had lasting impacts such as:

- The development of radar technology crucial for detecting enemy aircraft.
- The Manhattan Project which led to the creation of the atomic bomb.
- Penicillin, an antibiotic studied at GCE was mass produced for the first time.
- Jet engines were developed and used in combat for the first time.



Science - Year 10 Perspiration – Transpiration - Inspiration



Pictured here are Year 10 enjoying the fantastic new Science facilities at Shrewsbury Academy. Working hard, they identified suitable leaves outside on a lovely sunny day (perspiration).

Students worked as a team to set up an investigation to prove which surface of the leaf loses the most water, due to the process of water movement through plants, and its evaporation from leaves (transpiration). Students added Vaseline to some of the upper and lower sides of the leaves. They measured and shared the initial mass of their leaves with each other.

Next week they will reweigh their leaves to reveal which leaves lost the most

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or least water and prove which surface leaves lose most water from transpiration. These are inspirational times for the students and the staff as we enjoy our new facilities and take advantage of what we have recently gained.



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PE Extra Curricular

Our PE extra curricular offer is often advertised in our bulletin. After school clubs and competitions are common in many schools and promote healthy wellbeing and are a great way to get involved and represent the school in a variety of sports.

I have never seen a school run before school clubs with such regularity and with such high engagement from students. Shrewsbury Academy leads the way here. Currently anywhere up to 150 students access preschool clubs, often with a warm toasted bagel to finish before the school day starts. What a superb way to begin the day and look after yourself physically and mentally.

At the end of the summer term Shrewsbury Academy will run its annual rewards trips. To qualify to participate on the trips, students will be required to have good behaviour and good attendance.


In the coming weeks we will share details of the requirements and the venues we will be visiting this year.


