Dear Families

I am publishing this bulletin at the start of the half term week ahead of the week commencing the 2nd of June, as it contains details of the uniform changes below. As promised in last weeks bulletin the details of the uniform adaptions are now published and students can move to these adaptions immediately. We are excited to have made these changes, and our students have told us this will make them feel more comfortable in their appearance. Strict boundaries remain and I would ask that families please work with us to ensure students get this right. The details are below. I have also communicated this in a letter to you all. We continue to hold the highest expectations for our students and research shows uniform is an important part of this.

It has been such a positive but short four week half term. We are now truly enjoying our new facilities and the disruption of the building site that we lived with, is now reducing. The final stages of the build, renovating several remaining areas of the school is due to conclude before September. Throughout this half term student attendance has risen to above national average. This is brilliant to see and your continued support with this is greatly appreciated.

During the second half of the summer term, we will be transforming our SEND provision further. We have already opened our 'Lighthouse' facility for a small number of students, and we will now be developing our 'Bridge' provision. This seeks to clearly identify any barriers to learning that students may have, such as their reading ability. We will then target specific support to encourage and improve pupil engagement. We are already seeing some noticeable differences in how our students can engage in learning and we will continue to build on this momentum.

Uniform Changes

Last autumn, we joined the Trust in asking for feedback on aspects of our uniform code. In total, the Trust received 2,067 responses from families, students, and community members.

Since then, I have worked with staff from across the Trust, smaller groups of students and staff, to carefully review all of the feedback – which has now been refined into our new policy. The policy will be ready and finalised from September 2025, but so not to delay, the changes discussed below will start immediately after the half term break, Monday 2nd June.

Please note:

- Uniform requirements for skirts, jumpers, shirts, ties, socks, and coats remain unchanged.
- Changes have been made in the areas of hair, jewellery, makeup, footwear, trousers, and shorts.

We have made significant changes and taken steps to adapt our policies following detailed consultation. As we are in the summer term, the summer uniform adaptions now also apply. Students may remove their jumper at any time, but a coat should not be worn in place of this. We have a duty of care to ensure safety, students being required to remove piercings for PE is therefore required.








Year 9 Get Creative with Comic Design in ICT








Before and After School PE Clubs
