The new building features nine new science labs, which are equipped with the latest technology to enhance our students' learning experiences. Additionally, we have installed a lift to ensure disabled access to both floors, making our facilities inclusive and accessible to all.

Our maths new maths teaching rooms are and equipped to deliver fantastic learning, while our Design and Technology, Textiles, and Graphics rooms are outfitted with cutting-edge equipment including computer-controlled lathes. These spaces will allow our students to explore their creativity and develop practical skills for many years ahead.

Magnetic Science in the new STEAM block.





Pictured to the left are Year 7 enjoying some of the best school science facilities the UK can offer and learning the magnetic rule; like poles repel and opposite poles attract. Students came up with a class hypothesis that steel is magnetic and proved it. They went on to test other materials. They found out that most pure, elemental metals are not magnetic. Pure, elemental iron, cobalt and nickel are magnetic. Students learned that steel is an alloy containing iron which explains why it is magnetic. We are so delighted with the new facilities are students now have access too.

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Duke of Edinburgh

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Over the past two weeks, Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh students at Shrewsbury Academy have been improving their advanced map skills, with a particular focus on six-figure grid references and map symbols.

Students have learned to plot and locate six-figure grid references on maps, a crucial skill for their expedition section of the Duke of Edinburgh Award. This precision allows them to pinpoint locations within 100 meters, significantly improving their navigation accuracy compared to four-figure grid references, which only narrow down locations to within 1000 meters. Accurate navigation is essential for ensuring the safety and success of their expeditions, as it helps students stay on course and reach their designated checkpoints efficiently.

Additionally, students have enhanced their understanding of map symbols, enabling them to accurately identify and relate these symbols to real-world locations. This skill is vital as students are often required to provide three pieces of evidence to confirm their location. Being able to interpret map symbols correctly ensures that students can make informed decisions about their route, recognise landmarks, and avoid potential hazards.

Our students have enjoyed learning these new skills and we will continue to refine and practice these abilities to ensure they are well-prepared for their practice expedition.

Looking ahead, we will focus on contour lines, teaching students to recognise the height and shape of the land. This will further aid them in accurately determining their current and target locations. Understanding contour lines is crucial for assessing the difficulty of the terrain, planning efficient routes, and anticipating changes in elevation. This knowledge will help students manage their energy levels, avoid unnecessary detours, and ensure a safer and more enjoyable expedition experience.












PE Clubs – Summer Term
