#### **Dear Families**

Thank you for your valuable feedback regarding our uniform policy. We're pleased to share that, in response to your input, we have launched the updated uniform changes this week. Your voice has made a real difference - thank you for helping us improve.

We are now turning our attention to another important topic: mobile phones in school.

We are aware that many schools are moving towards banning mobile phones during the school day, in line with national guidance. At the same time, we understand that some parents feel reassured when their children have their phones with them for safety reasons. Currently in line with our policy, mobiles should be switched off in the bottom of school bags.

However, the evidence is clear; mobile phones can negatively impact concentration and learning, and they can also contribute to bullying and cause social pressures. They can be associated with poor sleep and some apps like tik tok use harmful algorithms to target specific content at our young people.

We want to make the right decision for our school community, and your views are essential in shaping that. Please take a few minutes to read the attached PDF, which outlines the key issues, and then follow the link provided to complete a short survey.

Your feedback will directly inform our next steps.

## Uniform Changes

Our uniform policy has been changed this week, and this has proven to be a very positive step for the students. Students are most pleased with the eyelashes rule relaxing and being able to wear more comfortable footwear.

Please support us by helping to ensure the standards we have now set are upheld. There should be no leggings of any sort, no coloured marks on trainers, black only, and false nails should be no longer than the end of the finger. Converse style canvas trainers / high tops are not allowed.

Nose piercings and ear piercings are fine, they now just need to be removed for PE lessons.

There have been some positive steps taken, thank you for taking part in the survey that has led to the changes.

We have made significant changes and taken steps to adapt our policies following detailed consultation. As we are in the summer term, the summer uniform adaptions now also apply. Students may remove their jumper at any time, but a coat should not be worn in place of this. We have a duty of care to ensure safety, students being required to remove piercings for PE is therefore required.

This kind of model-making not only brings learning to life but also strengthens memory and understanding, key to long-term success and exam performance.

The next step? Testing their structures to see which designs hold up best under simulated earthquake conditions! (and possibly eating the marshmallows!)


