Food Technology

As part of our ongoing exploration of eggs, students have ended the term by producing some truly impressive scotch eggs and chicken nuggets, worthy of any deli or butcher's counter! But beyond the delicious results, this project has been a rich learning experience.

Students investigated the scientific principles of coagulation and coating, deepening their understanding of how heat changes protein structure and different cooking methods such as boiling, frying, and baking. Students developed their practical skills by making their own breadcrumbs using a food processor and setting up a production line to apply the classic flour- eggbreadcrumb coating technique.

This hands-on work reinforces key concepts in food science, whilst also building independence, precision, and teamwork. It has been fantastic to see students so engaged in applying theory to practice and enjoying the results!







Travel and Tourism

This academic year marks the introduction of our Travel and Tourism course, and students have embraced it with great enthusiasm. We are adapting our curriculum to respond to what students are telling us, and offering opportunities to learn about subjects that have not previously been offered. As part of their initial learning, they recently delivered group presentations exploring various travel companies, gaining insight into the structure and dynamics of the tourism industry. The course is proving to be both engaging and enriching, with students developing a range of valuable skills that will serve them well in their future studies and careers
